- The embassies of Denmark, Finland, Norway and Sweden in Serbia, under the auspices of the Nordic Council of Ministers, organized a series of events on the topic of the circular economy, in Novi Sad, Kragujevac, Niš and Belgrade. The aim of the conferences was to raise awareness of key local partners about the importance of the circular economy, strengthen the determination to continue implementing the principles of circular economy in Serbia, and transferring Nordic experiences and knowledge in this important area. As pioneers of sustainable development and the circular economy, the Nordic countries fully share the European Commission's vision of a European Green Deal and a greener, non-toxic and more efficient production process. The partners of the Nordic embassies in the project are: the Nordic Business Alliance (NBA), the National Alliance for Local Economic Development (NALED), the Chamber of Commerce of Serbia, the Chamber of Commerce of Vojvodina, as well as the cities of Novi Sad, Kragujevac and Niš.

- With the great support of the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Danish Ministry of Culture, the Embassy of the Kingdom of Denmark organized an exhibition and lecture on modern Danish architecture in cooperation with the City of Niš and the Faculty of Civil Engineering and Architecture of the University of Niš. The exhibition's authors are Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Association of Danish Architectural Firms and DANISH, a platform for the promotion of Danish

architecture and urban planning. The exhibition presented examples of modern, sustainable architecture of well-known Danish companies. From socially sustainable projects aimed at creating interactions to environmentally sustainable emission reduction projects by converting energy from sun, water and wind to electricity. After the opening of the exhibition,

- The cooperation between the Niš City Administration for Agriculture and Rural Development and the Danish Development Project Supporting the Development of Fruits and Berries in Southern Serbia. The main outcome of the Danish intervention will be to improve the productivity and competitiveness of Serbian fruit and berry production, especially in the south of Serbia which will have a direct impact on increasing export revenues and improving the trade balance. The program will be implemented over 4 years. The Danish financial contribution will be a maximum of 5,360,000, supplemented with national sources from line ministry and municipalities as well as from private co-financing. The program itself is divided into two major components: capacity building of agricultural advisory services, training, enhancement of cooperation between producers, including sub-components for development and enhancement of cooperation across the value chain from producer to consumer and exporter, including market research and marketing cooperation. The program will focus on the entire value chain for certain types of fruit and berries in southern Serbia. This component will include technical support for introduction of new proven and selected fruit and forest varieties, new methods of modern production, harvesting and processing, including a sub-component of strengthening quality control, risk analysis, monitoring safety and certification of selected fruit and berry types. The grant scheme component will focus on investing in new production methods and improving quality and competition.
